How to Cite a(n) _____ on your Works Cited Sheet at the end:

1. Image/Photo/Painting: Artist. Title. Date. Website, URL. Date accessed.
 2. Online Article: Author, "Title." Magazine or Journal Name, Vol. #, No. #, Publisher, Date, pp. #, URL. Database. Date accessed.
 3. Digital File: Author. "Title." Year. Format, URL.
 4. Podcast: "Title." Website, date published, URL.
 5. Movie: Title. Director, Distributer, year, medium.
 6. Website: Author, Title. Organization, Year, URL. Date accessed.
 7. Video: "Title." YouTube, uploaded by, date uploaded, URL.
 8. Class Notes: Teacher. "Topic." Class name, date, school, city, state. Lecture.
 9. Web Page: Author. "Title." Website. Publisher, date, URL. Date accessed.
 10. Book: Author. Title. Publication City, Publisher, Publication date. Print.
 11. Online Book: Author. Title. Publisher, Publication date. Website, URL.
 12. Email: Author. "Re: Subject." Received by, date.
 13. Blog Posting: Editor, screen name, author. "Posting Title." Website, Version number, Publisher, URL. Date accessed.
 14. Interview: Name. Personal interview. Date.
 15. Tweet: @Handle. "Tweet." Twitter, date, time, URL.
 16. Constitution: "The Constitution of the United States," Amendment #.
 17. Music Score: Composer. "Title." Composition year. City: Publisher, Year published. Medium.

How to Cite a(n) _____ in your In-Text Parenthetical Citations Within Your Essay:

1. Image/Photo/Painting: (Artist's Last Name).
2. Online Article: (Author's Last Name).
3. Digital File: (Author's Last Name).
4. Podcast: ("Title").
5. Movie: (Title).
6. Website: (Author's Last Name).
7. Video: ("Title").
8. Class Notes: (Teacher's Last Name).
- 8-11. Web Page/Book/Online Book/Email: (Author's Last Name).
12. Blog Posting: (Editor's Last Name).
13. Interview: (Interviewee's Last Name).
14. Tweet: (@Handle).
15. Constitution: ("The Constitution...").
16. Music Score: (Composer's Last Name).

Helpful Hints:

- *please avoid using EasyBib and other citation generators
- *the in-text parenthetical citation contains the first thing in its corresponding Works Cited page entry
- *Works Cited pages are left margined, double-spaced, reverse indented, and in ABC order by the first word of each source
- *use the appropriate punctuation as listed on previous side
- *in-text citations occur after the sentence(s) that mention(s) that particular source
- *you must cite direct quotes AND paraphrasing within your essay
- *everything on the Works Cited sheet needs to be internally cited and vice versa
- *people's names on the Works Cited page are listed Last, First.
 - *unless there are multiple: Smith, John, and Sally Jones.
 - *more than 2 people: Smith, John, et. al.
- *Database refers to JSTOR, Academic Search Premier, etc.
- *Format refers to PDF, JPEG, etc.
- *Medium refers to DVD, Web, Print, etc.
- *dates are listed like 3 Dec. 2016.
 - *use just the year if that is all that you see
- *common knowledge information does NOT need to be cited
- *if you can't find something for the Works Cited page entry, just skip over to the next thing in the citation
- *citation info may be found at the bottom of the web page
- *anything that is underlined in the template on the other side can also be italicized (either or)
 - ~Underlined or *Italicized*: Movies, Magazines, Books, Plays, Websites
 - ~“Inside Quotation Marks”: Poems, Chapters, Articles, Web Pages, Songs, Episodes, Videos
